Chief Simpson stated a mandated First Responders PTSD application was signed and will be forwarded to the appropriate office. A K-9 was purchased for the Sheriff's Office. Chief Simpson is working on paperwork to submit to GDOT for the purchase of five flock cameras.

Cheryl Ates stated there were no problems during the 2024 elections. The total number of registered voters is 8,606 and there was a total of 6,081 votes.

Ronnie Smith stated Rebie Road will open temporarily until paving begins and Porter Road is completed. A tire amnesty is scheduled to start on December 10<sup>th</sup> and go through December 21, 2024.

Andy Lucas stated the IDA Board has received prices on land for sale at the industrial park and they continue to seek prospects. They are also working on submitting a Rural South Development Industry grant.

Randy Thompson said he appreciates all that attended the ribbon cutting held at the airport. The airport houses a fleet of 54 airplanes, and they continue to work on possibly building more hanger space. A few new programs will begin in the College of Education. One is the Parapro to Teach Tract Program and the other is the Teacher Apprenticeship Program. New "Welcome to Bleckley County Home of Middle Georgia State University" signs will be place throughout the county.

Melissa Barker announced some upcoming activities sponsored by the Chamber of Commerce.
